Revolution of Hope

We Vote Our Future So Everyone Thrives, No Exceptions

s the Nuns on the Bus & Friends hit the road for the "Vote Our Future" tour, our focus is on what it means to be active and engaged in our politics. Wherever we live

and whatever our background, it is essential not only to be engaged ourselves, but to invite as many people as possible into participation in our democratic process.

That is why this tour, for the first time, is the Nuns on the Bus & *Friends*. Answering the call of Pope Francis to "enlarge the space of our tent," for the first time our Bus riders include not just Sisters, but also representatives of other faith-based and secular coalition partners who share NETWORK's vision for the common good.

Withdrawal from our political process is not an option, especially at this moment in our history. Nor is it a Catholic value. In Catholic Social Teaching, participation — and the ability to participate — is essential to promoting justice in the world. It is about exercising the free will given to us by God at our creation and using it for the good.

Nuns on the Bus & Friends is representative of this participation, of Catholic Sisters and their collaborators recognizing the need to protect our freedom to participate in a vibrant democracy by spreading the word to communities across the country.

This past summer, Pope Francis described exclusion in societies as a real threat to democracy: "Whenever someone is marginalized, the whole social body suffers." This follows over a decade of teachings in which this pope has fervently called for people to have an active role in the systems and structures that shape our lives.

But in this country today, voter suppression and intimidation pose major threats to participation, especially the participation of people of color and young people. Some people say they will refuse to accept the outcomes of elections that do not favor their political agenda. And the threat of single-issue voting, which allows only the narrowest moral criteria in discerning how people should participate in building the common good, excludes or disqualifies all other moral concerns, even in the face of possibly losing the freedoms of our democracy.

Pope Francis says plainly, "We cannot tolerate or turn a blind eye to racism and exclusion in any form and yet claim to defend the sacredness of every human life."

NETWORK and Nuns on the Bus & Friends promote multi-issue voting, as outlined in the various freedoms of our Equally Sacred Checklist voter education resource. (See pages 15–16.) And on the nonpartisan "Vote Our Future" tour, we will invite all Catholics and people of goodwill to participate in building the future we want through multi-issue voting.

John Lewis, the late Congressman and Civil Rights activist whose name now adorns voting rights legislation awaiting action by Congress, said, "We should be creative, and we should accommodate the needs of every community to open up the democratic process."

The need for creative movement in the Spirit sparked the first Nuns on the Bus tour, back in 2012. And on this tour, our eighth, as Nuns on the Bus & Friends visits 20 cities in 11 states over two and a half weeks, we will engage and listen to the needs of the communities we encounter. We will draw together people, share our concerns, and make the connection to the freedoms we enjoy living in a democracy. It will be not only about self-determination, but also collective determination and action.

By calling for the freedom to be healthy, to be free from harm, to care for oneself and one's family, to live in a welcoming country, and to live on a healthy planet, we embrace the vision of Pope Francis, that "the only future worth building includes everyone."

We participate in building that future in hope. "Hope is the door that opens onto the future," the pope says. He adds, "A single individual is enough for hope to exist, and that individual can be you. And then there will be another 'you,' and another 'you,' and it turns into an 'us." Nuns on the Bus & Friends is an emphatic "us." And Pope Francis makes it clear: "When there is an 'us,' there begins a revolution."

On this "Vote Our Future" tour, may we participate joyfully in a revolution of hope.

'Vote Our Future' Tour Kicks Off

Nuns on the Bus & Friends Calls for Future Where 'Everyone Thrives, No Exceptions'

his fall, NETWORK's Nuns on the Bus is hitting the road again for the first time in six years. On this nationwide, nonpartisan Vote Our Future tour, the Nuns on the Bus & Friends will call on Catholics and all people of goodwill to be multi-issue voters.

"This year, it is important to be reminded that nothing is inevitable, that we actually have to 'Vote Our Future.' And as Pope Francis reminds us, 'The only future worth building includes everyone."

These were the words spoken by NETWORK's Executive Director, Mary J. Novak at a media conference on Capitol Hill on July 23 to announce the tour. The news received cheers from the roughly 200 people gathered in person and online — including Catholic Sisters, members of Congress, and advocacy partners. Participants held up signs saying "Vote Our Future,"

"Multi-Issue Voter," and more—along with a large cutout of the bus — all against the backdrop of the U.S. Capitol.

In addition to Novak, several of the tour's bus riders, as well as members of Congress, addressed the crowd. Many spoke about the freedoms at stake in the 2024 election — the freedoms to be healthy and safe, to participate in a vibrant democracy, to care for ourselves and our families, and to live on a healthy planet and in a welcoming country.

Novak also announced that, for the first time, the tour would include bus riders who aren't Catholic Sisters, but multifaith and secular coalition partners: hence Nuns on the Bus & Friends.

"Demanding justice and securing freedom is hard, and through NET-WORK, I have always found a strong and effective ally in this vital work. The nuns have always shown up, and that is why this time, I'm coming with them!" said Debbie Weinstein of the Coalition on Human Needs, one of the partner riders on this year's tour.

Sojourners President Rev. Adam Taylor, another rider, said "We can build a country where everyone is equally valued, where diversity is seen as a strength and not a weakness, and where everyone can thrive."

Sr. Mūmbi Kīgūtha, CPPS, President of Friends in Solidarity and one of the Catholic Sisters joining the bus tour, said: "The Bible tells us that when one part of the whole suffers, we all suffer. We need not choose to remain in suffering because we have agency. We have the power to transcend circumstances. I witnessed that reality when I rode the bus in 2018 and encountered people, together in their communities, doing the good work of building a more just and equitable world."

"I am here because I support Pope Francis' call for Catholics to be multi-issue voters," said Rep. Jesús "Chuy" García (IL-4), one of six Members of Congress to attend the media conference. "My social justice values are deeply connected to my faith and upbringing as a Catholic. That's why I joined Nuns on the Bus & Friends, to reaffirm our commitment to the right to seek asylum, as well as health care, climate, economic, and racial justice."

"There is nothing that says faith in action like Nuns on the Bus. Faith that is just words is not really faith. We have to act. And we act by voting," said Rep. Mary Gay Scanlon (PA-5).

Rep. Paul Tonko (NY-20) said, "Our work in Washington and the legislation we advance are a statement of our values and—to ensure a bright future for all—those values must run the gamut of addressing the climate crisis, protecting voting rights, strengthening health care, and more."

Also speaking at the gathering were Rep. Jim McGovern (MA-2), Rep. John Larson (CT-1), Rep. Rosa DeLauro (CT- 3), Amelia Kegan, Associate General Secretary for Policy and Advocacy at Friends Committee on National Legislation, and Sr. Eilis McCulloh, HM, NETWORK Grassroots Education & Organizing Specialist.

The two-and-a-half-week tour, from Sept. 30 to Oct. 18, will visit 20 cities in 11 states, meeting with communities at site visits, rallies, and townhalls, and will promote a future of flourishing for everyone.

From Philadelphia to San Francisco, this tour, part of NETWORK's nonpartisan voter education campaign, will promote the freedoms that are essential for a flourishing multiracial, multi-faith democracy and equip and mobilize everyone to exercise their right to vote — and make sure that their friends and families are voting too.

Nuns on the Bus & Friends proclaims that together, we will vote our future — so everyone thrives, no exceptions!

Why I'm Riding the Bus

We Must Show Up for Beloved Community

I thought it was a brilliant idea when NETWORK first initiated these tours back in 2012, in the middle of a difficult time for Catholic Sisters in the United States and NETWORK. I wanted to ride the bus then, as well as on subsequent tours in 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2018. But I never could because I was in the wrong place with other responsi-

his is my first time riding the bus for a Nuns on the Bus

Finally, in 2020, I would have been able to ride, but the COVID-19 pandemic shut down the world. I did follow the virtual tour that ultimately took the place of an in-person bus tour. I especially loved learning about the features of organizations throughout the country doing what they could to achieve the common good for all the community.

Now it is my time, and I am riding on the 2024 tour, the Nuns on the Bus & Friends Vote Our Future Tour.

My excitement comes from a conviction that the tour helps to bring about that "beloved community" called for by Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and repeated by Rep. John Lewis when he said:

"I think there's still a need for people in high places, not just in government, but in the private sector, in the academic community, in the media, in business to continue to be advocates, bringing people together, and build ... the beloved community."

This trip is bringing people together in community both on and off the bus. I see here the embodiment of the qualities of Sister-Spirit that the NETWORK board members invoke at the start of each meeting: "We reflect in awe and wonder at the Spirit acting in our world. We experience the richness that comes from recognizing that others come to the table with very different life experiences."

On my leg of the three-part journey, it delights me that inside the bus there is a beloved community, with NETWORK folks, including Executive Director Mary Novak, and with new friends I have never met before. Four are Sisters – Robbie, whom I do know from the NETWORK board, Erin, Quincy and Romina — each from different communities than mine who have ministered in other places than I have and in different works than mine.

We also have faith-filled folks with different life experiences. Rev. Dr. Cassandra Gould is an ordained elder in the A.M.E.

Church, whose bio says, "She can be found on the front lines fighting for justice from Ferguson to the D.C." Kristen Whitney Daniels is a journalist with stories to share on fierce advocacy for health care, especially for those with diabetes. Rev. Dr. Starsky Wilson advocates for children's rights and racial equity as President and CEO of the Children's Defense Fund.

This trip is bringing people together in community both on and off the bus.

In all, it is a wonderful diverse mix of backgrounds, ages, genders, races, and experiences, as it must also be in the beloved community. The Spirit acts in our world.

On my leg of the journey, we visit communities new to me in Pennsylvania, Connecticut, and New York, everywhere engaging folks in conversation through rallies, site visits, and ordinary encounters. As in any community, we will connect with each other and share insights and concerns. We will learn in a mutual education aimed at voting a future where everyone thrives. We all have different life experiences, and to build Dr. King's beloved community, we need the Spirit acting in everyone.

On our tour, as it says in NETWORK's strategic plan, we are taking the steps we can to mobilize a national movement of justice-seekers — a beloved community — who will consistently exercise power to influence federal policies so that everyone thrives. These policies that dismantle systemic racism, center equity and reparatory justice, achieve economic justice, secure our democracy, and protect our common home.

I am excited to be part of it. You can join us and be part of it too.

KAMALA HARRIS

FREEDOM TO CARE FOR OURSELVES AND OUR FAMILIES

- Pledges to cut taxes for workers and families with kids, by expanding the Earned Income Tax Credit and restoring the expanded Child Tax Credit (CTC) that reduced child poverty by half in 2021.
- (IRA) that increased taxes on the wealthy and IRS funds to audit wealthy taxpayers.
- The Biden-Harris admin. fought to grant student loan relief to millions of people.
- Supports workers' rights to unionize and bargain with the Protecting the Right to Organize (PRO) Act.
- Supported raising the federal minimum wage nationally to \$17/hour by 2028.
- Supported expanding access to SNAP and
 In 2016, cut the Supplemental Nutrition food support for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC).

FREEDOM TO BE **HEALTHY**

- Said "health care should be a right."
- The Biden-Harris admin. implemented lower premium costs for Affordable Care Act (ACA) enrollees by nearly \$2,000/yr.
- The Biden-Harris admin.'s American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) expanded Medicaid coverage in 41 states.
- Voted to pass the IRA's \$2,000/yr cap on prescription drug prices for seniors, and a \$35/month cap on insulin costs (2025).
- The Biden-Harris admin. increased investments in youth mental health care.
- Pledges to cancel \$7B in medical debt.

FREEDOM FROM HARM

- Supports a ban on assault weapons and large-capacity magazines.
- Oversees the White House Office of Gun Violence Prevention.
- The Biden-Harris admin. expanded Brady Background Checks and safe firearm storage, & cracked down on "ghost guns."
- Worked to enact the 2022 Bipartisan Safer Communities Act to break cycles of generational violence and bolster mental health and school security initiatives.
- Has long worked to advance the rights of LGBTQ+ people, pro-equality legislation, and racial equity in the government.



Commitment to the common good calls us to political participation by knowing the issues, engaging in conversations about our nation's future, and casting our vote! DONALD TRUMP

- The 2017 Trump tax law gave \$1.4T in tax breaks benefitting the wealthy and corporations. He vows to extend the breaks if elected, costing \$4T, the Congressional Budget Office estimates.
- Voted to pass the Inflation Reduction Act Proposed tariffs that economists predict to **lower avg. household income** and increase unemployment and inflation.
 - Proposed cuts to student aid and rescinded \$2B from Pell Grant reserve funds in his 2020 budget.
 - Appointed officials who rolled back workers' rights to form unions.
 - Opposed raising the federal minimum wage.
 - Assistance Program (SNAP) by \$60B. His proposed 2021 budget cut \$180B more.
 - Prioritized repeal of the Affordable Care Act (ACA) in 2017, cut enrollment funding by 90%, and flouted plans that failed to protect pre-existing conditions.
 - During the Trump administration, 2M more people became uninsured.
 - Proposed cuts to Medicaid (\$1.5T) and Medicare (\$800B) over 10 years in his 2020 budget.
 - Repeatedly vowed to terminate the ACA if re-elected, putting coverage at risk for 40M enrollees, including patients with pre-existing conditions.
 - Rolled back gun safety regulations, including one that made it harder for people with mental illness to buy a gun.
 - Promised the National Rifle Association (NRA, Trump's largest financial backer in 2016) that he would be "the best friend gun owners have ever had."
 - Promises to pass a national concealed carry law and roll back Biden-era restrictions if re-elected.
 - Vows to focus on "anti-white" racism and dismantle the Biden-Harris DEIA initiatives.



KAMALA HARRIS

PARTICIPATE IN A **VIBRANT**

- FREEDOM TO Prioritizes democracy and the right to vote in free, fair, and secure elections.
 - Pledges to certify the 2024 elections regardless of the winner.
 - Condemns the use of violent language.
- **DEMOCRACY** Announced Biden-Harris admin.'s steps to promote accurate voter info. and student voter participation, protect election workers, and fight voter suppression.
 - The Biden-Harris admin.'s Promoting Access to Voting Executive Order made voting and registration more accessible.
 - Promotes the John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act, the Freedom to Vote Act, and legislation to combat artificial intelligence influences in elections.

DONALD TRUMP

- Refused to commit to a peaceful transfer of power before the 2020 election and to concede his loss after numerous court challenges. Still contends the 2020 election was stolen.
- Urges supporters to "guard the vote" during the 2024 election and said there will be a "bloodbath" if he loses.
- Went to court in 2020 to make it more difficult for voters in Texas to vote by mail. Continues to promote restrictive state voter-ID laws.
- Attempted to intervene in the 2020 census by removing undocumented immigrants from the count.

LIVE ON A **HEALTHY PLANET**

- FREEDOM TO The U.S. rejoined the Paris Climate Agreement on the Biden-Harris admin.'s first day of office.
 - Cast tie-breaking vote to pass the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), the largest investment in climate initiatives to date, for renewable energy, electric cars and buses, home energy upgrades, and more.
 - The Biden-Harris admin. secured funding for clean water infrastructure projects and \$15B to replace lead pipes.
 - The Admin, launched the American Climate Corps to train young adults for green energy and climate resilience jobs.
 - As Senator, sponsored bills like the **Environmental Justice for All Act.**

- Withdrew from the Paris Agreement.
- Suppressed public scientific research on climate change and agriculture.
- Rolled back improved fuel efficiency standards and ended an Obama-era executive order aimed at reducing the federal government's emissions by 40% over ten years.
- Trump's EPA loosened regulations on toxic chemicals and opened nearly a million acres of federal public land to mineral exploitation, coal mining, and new oil and gas drilling.
- Promises to reinvest in fossil fuels and eliminate all Biden-Harris administration clean energy initiatives.

LIVE IN A WELCOMING **COUNTRY THAT VALUES DIGNITY** AND HUMAN **RIGHTS**

- FREEDOM TO The Biden-Harris admin. granted or renewed Temporary Protected Status (TPS) for nearly 700,000 immigrants from 16 countries deemed unsafe because of violence or natural disasters.
 - Supports comprehensive immigration reform and an earned pathway to citizenship, including for Dreamers.
 - migration from Honduras, Guatemala, and El Salvador.
 - The Biden-Harris admin. expanded health care access for 600,000 DACA recipients.
 - The Biden-Harris admin. granted work permits and protection from deportation to 500,000 eligible undocumented spouses of U.S. citizens.
 - Pledged to sign the bipartisan border security bill which will severely limit the right to seek asylum in the U.S.

- Attempted to end TPS for people from 6 countries, putting an estimated 300,000 people at risk of being deported to countries previously deemed unsafe.
- His administration intentionally separated thousands of children and infants from their parents at the U.S.-Mexico border.
- Oversaw efforts to address root causes of Threatened repeatedly to withhold federal funds from "sanctuary cities."
 - Adopted a 2017 "travel ban" on predominantly Muslim countries, dramatically increased immigrant detentions, and imposed tighter restrictions on legal immigration.
 - Promises to launch "the largest domestic deportation operation in American history" if elected in 2024.
 - Said migrants are "vermin" who will "poison the blood of the nation."





Coston Fellows are part of a learning community of faithful, young justice-seekers working to achieve an inclusive, multiracial, multi-faith democracy through their contributions to NETWORK's advocacy at the federal level. Fellows lead Y.A.L.L. Chapters at their universities, organize Get-Out-the-Vote events on their campuses, articulate NETWORK's policy agenda to their peers, and serve as issue-based canvassers in their communities. Our inaugural 2024 cohort comprises ten students from universities in Florida, California, Michigan, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin.


