<b>FREEDOM TO LIVE ON A HEALTHY PLANET</b>	<b>Mostly yes.</b> "We need every tool to help us <u>reduce</u> waste, clean the air and produce renewable energy." Also supports <u>biomass energy</u> and <u>nuclear energy</u> . Voted <u>against</u> requiring <u>net zero</u> greenhouse gas emissions by 2045.	<b>Environment</b> <b>Should addressing climate change be a top priority?</b>	<b>Mostly no.</b> <u>Opposed</u> a bill <u>addressing</u> climate change. <u>Opposed</u> a carbon tax. <u>Supported</u> incentivizing farmers to use renewables. Sponsored a bill fostering <u>climate-smart</u> farming. In 2014 said climate change <u>didn't cause</u> California drought.
	<b>Increase.</b> <u>Voted to require</u> community and employment benefits in new clean energy projects. Secured <u>funding</u> for workforce training at a growing community college. Supports <u>overtime pay for farmworkers</u> and state budget funding for <u>infrastructure</u> .	<b>Economy</b> <b>Decrease or increase government investment in, and regulation of, the economy?</b>	<b>Mixed.</b> <u>Opposed</u> two bipartisan bills funding <u>infrastructure</u> and boosting domestic <u>manufacturing</u> . <u>Supports</u> spending more to deal with drought. Supported a short-term <u>suspension</u> of a gas tax and a community project <u>funding</u> bill.
<b>FREEDOM FROM HARM</b>	<b>Mixed.</b> <u>Voted to ban</u> firearm marketing to minors. <u>Voted to enable</u> <u>police seizure</u> of ghost guns from people with restraining orders. <u>Voted against</u> a ban on manufacturing firearms <u>without</u> a state license. <u>Voted against</u> tightening the permit application process.	<b>Gun Laws</b> <b>Loosen or tighten gun regulation?</b>	<b>Loosen.</b> <u>Opposed</u> <u>banning</u> assault weapons. <u>Opposed</u> raising the legal age for gun purchases and criminalizing gun trafficking. <u>Voted against expanding</u> background checks.

	Introduced a bill to <u>fund</u> hiring police in their own communities, to bring <u>trust</u> between the community and the officers. Introduced a bill <u>helping prevent</u> hiring police with a misconduct history, to hold them "accountable" and " <u>root out</u> bad cops."	<b>Criminal Justice</b> <b>How to ensure effectiveness and fairness in law enforcement?</b>	<u>Voted against</u> addressing racial profiling and use of <u>deadly force</u> . <u>Supports</u> funding de-escalation training and mental health services for police, so they "know they have our support." <u>Supports</u> providing childcare to deal with a police shortage.

FREEDOM TO BE HEALTHY	<b>Increase.</b> Would work to <a href="#">lower</a> drug costs and insurance premiums. <a href="#">Supports</a> the Affordable Care Act and wants to <a href="#">expand</a> Medicare. In 2020 voted <a href="#">for</a> California to produce its <a href="#">own medications</a> , like insulin, more affordably.	<b>Health Care</b> Increase or decrease government support for health care?	<b>Mixed.</b> Says the Affordable Care Act " <a href="#">failed</a> " and would ensure "health care remains in the hands of" the "doctor, <a href="#">not</a> the government." <a href="#">Sponsored</a> bills funding <a href="#">hospitals</a> in underserved communities and <a href="#">asthma</a> care.
FREEDOM TO LIVE IN A WELCOMING COUNTRY	<b>Mixed:</b> Supports <a href="#">better securing</a> the border and <a href="#">revising</a> the asylum process. Believes in "a pathway to citizenship" for " <a href="#">law-abiding</a> " people. <a href="#">Supported</a> a bill making <a href="#">non-citizens</a> who meet certain requirements eligible for election to a Democratic county central committee.	<b>Immigration</b> Defend the right to asylum and support a path to citizenship for DACA participants brought to the U.S. as children?	<b>Mixed:</b> Supports <a href="#">comprehensive</a> reform by <a href="#">combatting</a> illegal immigration and creating "a <a href="#">fair</a> process" for earning citizenship. <a href="#">Supported</a> bills providing <a href="#">paths</a> to legal status to <a href="#">Dreamers</a> and <a href="#">farmworkers</a> . <a href="#">Voted to tighten</a> border security.
FREEDOM TO PARTICIPATE IN A VIBRANT DEMOCRACY	<b>Mostly easier.</b> Would " <a href="#">protect</a> the right to vote for all Americans" while preventing "voter fraud." <a href="#">Voted to</a> continue California's <a href="#">universal</a> vote-by-mail system. <a href="#">Voted against</a> allowing convicted felons to register and vote while on <a href="#">parole</a> .	<b>Voting Rights</b> Make voting harder or easier?	<b>Harder.</b> Supports <a href="#">bolstering</a> "election security." <a href="#">Sponsored</a> a bill <a href="#">requiring</a> voter photo ID and <a href="#">banning</a> Washington, DC from mailing out ballots. <a href="#">Voted against</a> <a href="#">expanding</a> voting access.
FREEDOM TO CARE FOR OURSELVES AND OUR FAMILIES	<b>Easier.</b> Is "proud to stand in <a href="#">solidarity</a> with" the California Labor Federation, which <a href="#">endorsed</a> him. <a href="#">Supported</a> bills <a href="#">protecting</a> faculty bargaining rights, giving farmworkers <a href="#">more ways</a> to vote in union elections, and giving family childcare providers the <a href="#">right</a> to unionize.	<b>Labor</b> Make it easier or harder for unions to organize?	<b>Mostly harder.</b> <a href="#">Opposed</a> <a href="#">expanding</a> union organizing rights. <a href="#">Supported</a> ending a rail shutdown by <a href="#">voting for</a> an agreement between unions and management, but <a href="#">opposed</a> a related bill giving railroad workers <a href="#">seven</a> sick days.
	<b>Yes, but unclear how much.</b> Calls \$7.25 " <a href="#">low</a> ." In 2013 <a href="#">voted to</a> gradually raise CA's minimum wage to <a href="#">\$10 per hour</a> by 2016. <a href="#">Did not vote</a> on a 2016 bill to raise it steadily to <a href="#">\$15 in 2022</a> .	<b>Minimum Wage</b> Raise federal minimum from \$7.25/hour?	<b>No position found.</b>
	<b>Support.</b> <a href="#">Voted to</a> increase awareness of the Public Service Loan Forgiveness program for community college faculty. Supported an effort to <a href="#">increase</a> the number of Californians accessing loan forgiveness programs.	<b>Student Financial Aid</b> Support lowering interest on student loans and/or forgiving them?	<b>No.</b> <a href="#">Voted to repeal</a> Biden's student debt forgiveness plan. <a href="#">Voted to</a> end the pandemic student loan payment pause.
	<b>No recent position found.</b> In 2019 <a href="#">voted to increase</a> tax rates for Californians making \$1 million and above.	<b>Taxes</b> Raise or lower taxes on corporations and wealthier individuals?	<b>Lower.</b> <a href="#">Voted for</a> the 2017 Trump <a href="#">tax cuts</a> that included the largest corporate cuts in U.S. history and major tax cuts for the wealthy. <a href="#">Voted to rescind</a> \$45.6 billion in funding that would <a href="#">enforce</a> the tax code for businesses or households making over \$400,000.
