FREEDOM TO LIVE ON A HEALTHY PLANET	Yes. Supports investing in carbon reduction technology and the development of renewable energy. Voted for funding \$369 billion in climate and clean energy initiatives. Supports both offshore oil lease sales, and investment in "America's burgeoning offshore wind sector."	Environment Should addressing climate change be a top priority?	No. Supports empowering "energy producers," particularly in "oil and gas." Voted against funding \$369 billion in climate and clean energy initiatives. Calls existing energy regulations "overburdensome."

Immigration Defend the right to asylum and support a path to citizenship for DACA participants brought to the U.S. as children?	Opposes : <u>Deport</u> "illegal immigrants who commit crimes." "We MUST <u>secure</u> our border to keep bad individuals out and to encourage LEGAL immigration." Unclear on DACA.
