FREEDOM TO LIVE ON A HEALTHY PLANET	Yes. "The climate is changing and we need to act." We "can't keep kicking the climate can down the road." Supported a \$369 billion commitment to climate and clean energy, the biggest investment in U.S. history. Voted to keep programs reducing greenhouse gas emissions.	Environment Should addressing climate change be a top priority?	No. "Radical leftists have spent months pushing mass hysteria to declare a climate emergency." Opposed \$369 billion climate and energy investments. "We can't keep pushing this green agenda that is actually destroying our jobs and our economy."

Opposed efforts to block red flag laws, ghost gun restrictions, and other firearm regulations.	<u>Gun Laws</u> Loosen or tighten gun regulations?	Loosen. Calls background checks, red flag laws, and waiting periods unconstitutional." Supporters should "maybe strap on a Glock" to be ready for the 2024 election.
	Expand. "Will continue to fight for the LGBTQ+ community." Voted for the Equality Act, to expand protections against discrimination.	<u>LGBTQ Rights</u> Limit or expand rights for LGBTQ+ people?	Limit. "They kicked God out of schools and welcomed the Drag Queens." Adding sexual orientation to nondiscrimination law infringes on religious freedom. Will shut down "this whole push for transgenderism."
	Voted to keep a Washington, DC law banning neck restraints and expanding body cameras. Sponsored a bill to confront a crisis of missing and murdered Indigenous women by helping tribal police provide more protection. Condemned efforts to defund police.	Criminal Justice How to ensure effectiveness and fairness in law enforcement?	"Stop this assault on our police." Opposes civilian review boards. Protect police from lawsuits. "Police do not target people of color." Dismantle the FBI. Don't let people seek U.S. asylum if they're leaving a country with "elevated crime."

FREEDOM TO LIVE IN A WELCOMING COUNTRY	Mixed : Supports a bipartisan immigration bill to address border reform. Sponsored a bill to give DACA participants a pathway toward permanent residence after U.S. military service.	Immigration Defend the right to asylum and support a path to citizenship for DACA participants brought to the U.S. as children?	Opposes: Opposes the bipartisan immigration bill. It "legalizes nearly 2 million invaders." Opposes the military pathway for DACA bill. Supports ending automatic citizenship for anyone born in the U.S. Calls for expanding border wall.
FREEDOM TO PARTICIPATE IN A VIBRANT DEMOCRACY	Easier. Would "fortifyour sacred right to vote." Supported the Freedom to Vote Act, which would have required same-day voter registration, made Election Day a public holiday, required a minimum number of early voting days, and let people vote absentee by mail for any reason.	<u>Voting Rights</u> Make voting harder or easier?	Harder. Wants to end early voting. "We have to get back to voting on Election Day." Wants electronic voting machines declared unconstitutional. Opposed and then supported mail balloting.
FREEDOM TO CARE FOR OURSELVES AND OUR FAMILIES	Easier. Supported the Protect the Right to Organize Act, which expands the rights of unions to organize workers.	Labor Make it easier or harder for unions to organize?	Unclear. Has <u>criticized</u> the "union bosses" of teachers unions.
	Raise. " <u>Raise</u> the minimum wage to a living wage of at least \$15/hour."	Minimum Wage Raise federal minimum from \$7.25/hour?	No position found.
	Yes. Supports Biden student debt relief package. Would work to <u>reduce</u> the "soaring costs of higher education."	Student Financial Aid Support lowering interest on student loans and/or forgiving them?
