FREEDOM TO LIVE ON A HEALTHY PLANET	Yes. "As a third-generation farmer, I know firsthand how climate change affects Montana. From <u>wildfires</u> to droughts to floods, we must address this issue." <u>Voted</u> for <u>\$369 billion</u> in climate and clean energy initiatives. <u>Supports</u> multiple energy sources including coal with carbon emission capture.	Environment Should addressing climate change be a top priority?	No. Humans have <u>no "appreciable impact"</u> on global warming. "The climate has always been changing <u>Stand strong</u> against the radical climate cult agenda." <u>Supports</u> "responsibly" developing "all forms of American energy." FREEDOM TO BE HEALTHY	Increase. Voted for <u>Affordable Care Act</u> . <u>Voted</u> <u>to cap</u> Medicare insulin costs at \$35/month and let Medicare negotiate <u>lower prices</u> from drug companies. "Montanans <u>shouldn't have to</u> <u>choose</u> between Rx drugs and putting food on the table." <u>Expand</u> rural telehealth.	<u>Health Care</u> Increase or decrease government support for health care?	Decrease. " <u>Return healthcare</u> to pure privatization."" <u>More government control</u> of our health care has only made things worse." Says <u>Affordable Care Act caused</u> "higher premiums." Said Biden's <u>border</u> <u>policies</u> had "failed." <u>Supports</u> DACA; "breaking a promise to these children is not the solution."	Immigration Defend the right to asylum and support a path to citizenship for DACA participants brought to the U.S. as children?	<b>Opposes</b> : Called the 2024 bipartisan <u>border</u> <u>security bill</u> "political theater." 	Yes. In 2021: "the minimum wage needs to <u>come</u> <u>up</u> ."
