FREEDOM TO LIVE ON A HEALTHY PLANET	Yes. "We need to invest in meaningful climate action now." Voted for \$369 billion investment in climate and renewable energy, "the biggest investment in U.S. history." "We must increase the use of renewable energy" while regulating natural gas extraction. Supports tax credits for clean energy workers.	Environment Should addressing climate change be a top priority?	No. "Human activity is one of the many contributing factors" to rising global temperatures. "An anti-fossil fuel agenda" is driven by "radical environmental groups." Would "unleash oil and gas production."  Would halt clean energy subsidies. Would "mitigate the risk of climate change" with "market-driven solutions."
	Increase. Supports federal funding for infrastructure and internet, including \$1.2 trillion infrastructure bill and policies that create "goodpaying jobs." Would regulate banking overdraft penalties and other "hidden fees." Supports cracking down on companies that shrink products without lowering prices. Wants support for the childcare sector.	Economy  Decrease or increase government investment in, and regulation of, the economy?	Mostly decrease. To address inflation, "we have to get spending back under control" and stop "the war on energy." "Washington must take a more active role in promoting American innovation" but "cut the red tape and get out of the way of private citizens and firms trying to innovate."
FREEDOM FROM HARM	<b>Tighten.</b> Changed to a pro-regulation position after 2012 Sandy Hook massacre. Supports expanded background checks, temporarily keeping firearms from people who pose danger, and banning "weapons of war" like AR-15 rifles. Voted for the bipartisan gun safety bill.	Gun Laws Loosen or tighten gun regulations?	Mostly loosen. "I'm a proud gun owner who will fight for our Constitutional right to keep and bear arms" and "a strong supporter of the Second Amendment." In 2022 criticized support for "gun restrictions like an assault weapons ban & red flag laws." But supports background checks.
	Expand. Sponsored a bill prohibiting discrimination based on sexual orientation and gender identity. Voted to federally recognize same-sex marriage. Sponsored a bill to ban commercial conversion therapy.	<u>LGBTQ Rights</u> Limit or expand rights for LGBTQ+ people?	<b>Mixed</b> . Opposes transgender students participating in women's sports. But while CEO, his hedge fund promoted LGBTQ hiring to "grow the best talent across gender identity" and "sexual orientation," with "fully paid coverage for gender transitions."
FREEDOM FROM HARM	<b>Tighten.</b> Changed to a pro-regulation position after 2012 Sandy Hook massacre. Supports expanded background checks, temporarily keeping firearms from people who pose danger, and banning "weapons of war" like AR-15 rifles. Voted for the bipartisan gun safety bill.	Criminal Justice How to ensure effectiveness and fairness in law enforcement?	"Dangerous rhetoric and lax law enforcement policies have led to an increase in crime." Fewer police "means less safe communities." Police are "poorly funded" and need "qualified immunity," which protects police from civil lawsuits for use of excessive force.

FREEDOM TO BE HEALTHY	Increase. The effort to repeal the Affordable Care Act is "a venomous snake that will bite a lot of Americans." Introduced a bill to lower prescription drug costs for low-income Medicare enrollees. Sponsored a bill capping insulin price at \$35. Voted for government to negotiate Medicare drug costs.	<u>Health Care</u> Increase or decrease government support for health care?	Mostly decrease. In 2022 <u>criticized</u> his Republican primary opponent Mehmet Oz for his <u>past</u> support of the Affordable Care Act. Has discussed <u>potentially cutting</u> "entitlements." Would " <u>fight</u> for" veterans' health care.
FREEDOM TO LIVE IN A WELCOMING COUNTRY	Supports comprehensive immigration reform that honors dignity of those seeking a better life, including protecting Dreamers, creating fair paths to citizenship, and prioritizing secure borders. Sponsored S.1891—NO BAN Act to disallow religion-based immigration ban.	Immigration Defend the right to asylum and support a path to citizenship for DACA participants brought to the U.S. as children?	Supports a return to Trump's border policies: "Finish the wall. Keep people going only through legal entry points." Wants to end the right to asylum in the U.S. and change law so asylum applications could be processed outside of the U.S. No position found on DACA.
FREEDOM TO PARTICIPATE IN A VIBRANT DEMOCRACY	Easier. Introduced bills to improve voting access for those with disabilities.  Sponsored two bills to expand voter registration and voting access.	<u>Voting Rights</u> Make voting harder or easier?	Harder. Would require "a photo ID to vote" and ballots "in by Election Day." Disagrees with Act 77 no-excuse mail-in voting, but "it's something" Republicans have "got to embrace."
FREEDOM TO CARE FOR OURSELVES AND OUR FAMILIES	<b>Easier</b> . Supports "protecting workers' fundamental right to organize." Sponsored a bill expanding rights to organize unions. "We have to stop them [Republicans] from trying to destroy unions."	<u>Labor</u> Make it easier or harder for unions to organize?	No position found.
	<b>Yes.</b> "\$7.25/hour is <u>not enough</u> for working people to live on." <u>Voted</u> to raise. In 2019 <u>supported</u> gradually raising the minimum wage to \$15/hour.	<u>Minimum Wage</u> Raise federal minimum from \$7.25/hour?	<b>No.</b> "I wouldn't change the minimum wage we have now I wouldn't raise it."
	<b>Yes.</b> Supported canceling \$10,000 of student debt for those making less than \$125,000 a year. Opposed an effort to overturn Biden's student debt relief plan. In 2019 sponsored a bill allowing eligible student loan borrowers to refinance at lower rates.	Student Financial Aid Support lowering interest on student loans and/or forgiving them?	<b>No</b> . "Biden's <u>student loan</u> 'forgiveness' scheme forces the majority of Pennsylvanians without college degrees to pay someone else's debt." <u>It</u> <u>is</u> "unfair & un-American."
	Raise. Supports reversing 2017 "massive tax cuts for the ultra-wealthy and big corporations." Would make largest oil companies pay higher taxes on excess profits, make "wealthy tax cheats and the biggest corporations pay their fair share of taxes."	Taxes Raise or lower taxes on corporations and wealthier individuals?	Mostly lower. Opposes "tax increases." Inflation is "not greedflation [by] you in this room, business people, it's not because you're greedy." Said "we need to make permanent the [2017] Tax Cuts and Jobs Act," the biggest corporate cuts in U.S. history.
