FREEDOM TO LIVE ON A HEALTHY PLANET	Yes. Is "incredibly <u>concerned</u> " about climate. Supports being "aggressive" about emission reductions while being " <u>realistic</u> " and <u>innovative</u> . <u>Natural gas</u> is "important," but "we can findreductions" and increase carbon capture.	Environment Should addressing climate change be a top priority?	No. Voted <u>against</u> funding <u>\$369 billion</u> in climate and clean energy initiatives. <u>Pushed</u> for Trump to pull out of the Paris pact to reduce global warming. FREEDOM TO BE HEALTHY	Increase. <u>Supported lowering</u> drug prices for Medicare beneficiaries. <u>Sponsored</u> a bill directing \$442 million to <u>upgrade</u> veterans' healthcare facilities in Texas. <u>Supports</u> the Affordable Care Act, and in 2019 <u>condemned</u> repeal attempt.	<u>Health Care</u> Increase or decrease government support for health care?	Decrease. People should "manage their own health care, <u>not</u> the bureaucracy." <u>Opposed</u> a bill <u>reducing</u> drug prices. Would "revisit" the effort to <u>replace</u> the Affordable Care Act.
