	Tammy Baldwin Democrat Incumbent tammybaldwin.com	Election Day: Tuesday, November 5 th	Eric Hovde Republican erichovde.com
FREEDOM TO LIVE ON A HEALTHY PLANET	Yes. "The longer we fail to act, the more costly climate change will be." Supported the Inflation Reduction Act to "tackle climate change." Voted to update public transit for climate friendliness. Committed to working with local communities to find solutions.	Environment Should addressing climate change be a top priority?	No. His campaign website doesn't mention climate. The push to end fossil fuel use before the next half-century is "delusional." To think you're "going to move an economy of this size from its existing energy sources in a decade, you are smoking crack."
	Increase. "Small businesses are the backbone of our economy." Supports Buy American rules and fair-trade practices. Opposes "corporate mergers that reduce competition." Supported the \$1.2 trillion infrastructure bill.	Economy Decrease or increase government investment in, and regulation of, the economy?	Decrease. Calls for a private-sector-driven "progrowth environment." Criticizes recent growth in size of national debt. Says he has the business experience needed "to restore economic sanity."
FREEDOM FROM HARM	Tighten. "Congress has <u>failed</u> to take action on gun violence and far too many lives have been lost." <u>Supports</u> background checks, anti-violence programs, and mental health services.	<u>Gun Laws</u> Loosen or tighten gun regulations?	Likely loosen. No current position found. In a 2012 campaign for U.S. Senate: "I fully support the <u>rights</u> of law-abiding citizens to keep and bear arms, no exception."
	Expand. Sponsored the Equality Act, banning discrimination against LGBTQ+ people: "It is wrong that LGBTQ+ people can be denied an apartment, cut from a job, or face other forms of discrimination." Brought 12 Senate Republicans on board to protect same-sex and interracial marriages.	<u>LGBTQ Rights</u> Limit or expand rights for LGBTQ+ people?	Limit. Supports restrictions on gender-affirming treatments for minors and believes "men shouldn't be playing [in] girls sports—period."
	"Wisconsinites <u>deserve</u> to be safe in their communities." <u>Secured funding</u> for <u>law enforcement</u> for training, <u>transparency</u> , and accountability. Worked to ensure <u>first responders</u> can give overdose reversal drugs. Sponsored the <u>FEND Off Fentanyl Act</u> .	Criminal Justice How to ensure effectiveness and fairness in law enforcement?	Opposes "defunding the police," what he calls the "left's dystopian vision."

FREEDOM TO BE HEALTHY	Increase. "No American should have to choose between basic necessities and paying for the drugs they need." Introduced the Capping Prescription Costs Act. Supports expanding Obamacare, Medicare, and Medicaid. Calls for addressing "racial disparities that exist in our nation's health care system."	<u>Health Care</u> Increase or decrease government support for health care?	Decrease. "Obamacare created monopolies and oligarchies and wiped out the family doctor." Repeal it. It's "stupid" to keep young adults on their parents' insurance until age 26. Would continue protecting benefits for preexisting conditions.
FREEDOM TO LIVE IN A WELCOMING COUNTRY	Mixed. Backed the 2024 bipartisan <u>border bill</u> : "I voted to <u>secure</u> our border, support law enforcement, & stop the fentanyl from coming in." Supports DACA <u>Dreamers</u> , "who have only known America as their home."	Immigration Defend the right to asylum and support a path to citizenship for DACA participants brought to the U.S. as children?	Opposes. "Biden opened our southern border," letting "criminals and terrorists" enter and "drug cartels to flood our streets with fentanyl." Advocates stricter security measures. Called 2024 bipartisan border bill "a total joke." No position found on DACA.
FREEDOM TO PARTICIPATE IN A VIBRANT DEMOCRACY	Easier. Sponsored legislation to stop statesanctioned voter suppression efforts: "The right to access the ballot box is foundational to how our democracy works."	<u>Voting Rights</u> Make voting harder or easier?	Likely harder. Would "tighten up our voting process clean up our voting system." Addressing voter fraud claims, said "Almost nobody in a nursing home," is at a point in life to vote. But says the "elderly should absolutely vote."
FREEDOM TO CARE FOR OURSELVES AND OUR FAMILIES	Easier. "Unions <u>built</u> the middle class." <u>Sponsored</u> a bill to protect workers' right to organize: "Wisconsin has a <u>proud</u> <u>tradition</u> of giving workers a strong voice."	<u>Labor</u> Make it easier or harder for unions to organize?	No position found.
	Yes. Sponsored 2021 legislation to raise the federal minimum wage to \$15 per by 2025: "It is past time to <u>raise</u> the minimum wage."	Minimum Wage Raise federal minimum from \$7.25/hour?	No. "Minimum wage was <u>never</u> supposed to be a living wage." Low-wage jobs should <u>motivate</u> people to find better careers.
	Yes. It "has the potential to provide significant <u>relief</u> to millions of borrowers." <u>Sponsored</u> legislation in 2022 to provide student loan forgiveness to beginning <u>farmers and ranchers</u> .	Student Financial Aid Support lowering interest on student loans and/or forgiving them?	No. "It's <u>unfair</u> at every single level." Biden's debt forgiveness plan "does NOTHING to address the <u>cost</u> of higher education."
	Raise. "Hardworking Wisconsin families should not be paying more in taxes than the wealthiest Americans." Calls for a fairer tax code and an end to loopholes that benefit "super wealthy" money managers.	Taxes Raise or lower taxes on corporations and wealthier individuals?	Lower. Has <u>supported</u> "lowering the corporate tax rate and eliminating loopholes and deductions." <u>Supports</u> a minimum tax rate for corporations.
