

THE FIRST 100 DAYS: WHAT TO EXPECT

Shock and awe: President Trump will begin with a bang!

Administrative Action

- January 20
- Executive Orders attacking all areas of NETWORK's agenda
- Biggest focus: immigration enforcement and deportations



Legislation in the 119th Session

- Budget Reconciliation: "One Big, Beautiful Bill"
- What's on the table?
 - Tax cuts for the rich
 - Cuts to healthcare and food programs to pay for the tax cuts
 - Cuts to clean energy incentives
 - Immigration and border militarization funding

119TH CONGRESS: THINGS TO REMEMBER

Politics = Math!

- House: Passage of Bill needs 218 –
 Republicans can only lose 2
- Senate: Reconciliation needs 51 Republicans can only lose 3
- All other Senate bills need 60 Republicans need 7 Democrats

It's Hard for Congress to Walk and Chew Gum at the Same Time.

- Reconciliation is hard (ex. Build Back Better)
- Crowded calendar of must-pass bills
 - Two Appropriations Bills (March 2025 and September 2026)
- Point of Leverage: Debt ceiling debate in early summer



When we fight, we win.

What we lose on the Hill, we win back home!

TAX POLICY

Challenges

- Significant parts of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Acts may become permanent law
- Benefits for wealthy individuals and corporations face extension
- Campaign proposals could end up in legislation

Opportunities

- Changes to the Child Tax Credit and Earned Income Tax Credit
- Comprehensive bill text expected in Q1, allowing for analysis and planning

PROTECT SNAP

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) has served for decades as our nation's most essential tool to prevent hunger. Even with SNAP, 34 million of our neighbors face hunger—including 9 million children.

Challenges

- Congress must hold the line against cuts to current SNAP benefit levels
- Congress must oppose new and more punishing work-reporting requirements

Opportunities

 Congress must remove the Farm Bill's unjustifiable lifetime ban on SNAP benefits for individuals convicted of drug felonies

Fun fact: Many food programs, like SNAP, are in the Farm Bill

PROTECT MEDICAID FROM CUTS THAT KILL

Medicaid and the Affordable Care Act (ACA) provide affordable healthcare coverage for millions of us.

Challenge

 Congress must block efforts to cut Medicaid or change its structure through block grants, per capita spending caps, or punishing work-reporting requirements

Opportunity

 Congress must make the ACA premium tax credits permanent so we can all afford health insurance



CLIMATE AND CLEAN ENERGY TRANSITION

Challenges

- Partisan divides
- Energy permitting stalemates: balancing clean energy & fossil fuel permitting reforms
- Critical mineral dependence: geopolitical tensions and limited domestic production

Opportunities

- Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) incentives
 - Expand clean energy adoption and manufacturing
 - Prevent the rollback of IRA's clean energy tax credits
- Energy security: Accelerate domestic clean energy production
- Economic and job growth: create jobs and drive economic development

IMMIGRATION POLICY AND MORE

Keep Families Together, Protect People Fleeing Persecution, and Repair Our Immigration System

The Gospel and Catholic Social Teaching are clear: we are called to love our neighbor and welcome the immigrant. For decades, Catholics have been steadfast in their calls for a just reform of the nation's immigration system.

Challenges

- Criminalization of immigrants and immigration
- Mass separation of immigrant families --> devastating hardship and emotional distress

Alternatively, Congress Must...

- Ensure humanitarian/asylum protections
- Ensure due process according to the Immigration and Naturalization Act
- Provide opportunities for legal pathways to citizenship
